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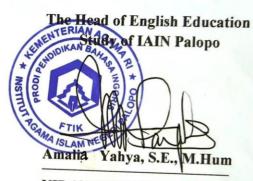

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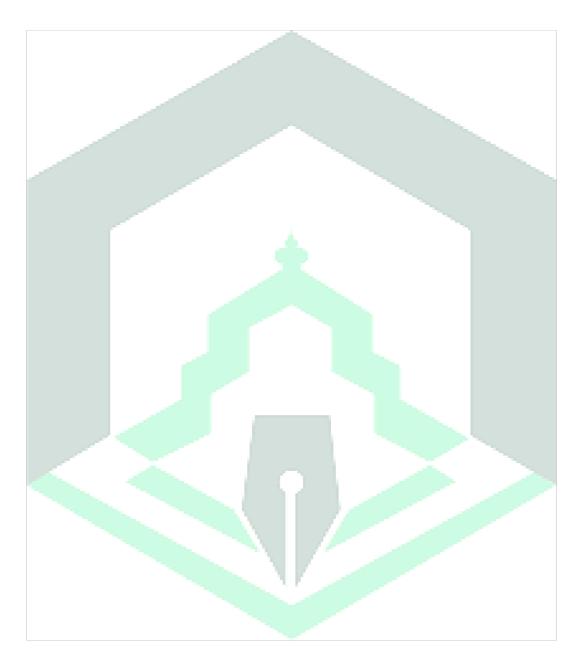
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ABSTRACT

Nur Widia Nengsi, 2022, "The Implementation of Hallo: Speak English Application to Enhance English Speaking Skill at the Eleventh Grade of Man Palopo" Thesis English Study Program Educational Department In the State Islamic Institute of Palopo, Supervised by Jufriadi and Husnaini

This Research focused on improving students' speaking skills at Madrasah Aliyah Negeri Palopo by using Hallo: Speak English Application. The researcher tried to investigate whether using Hallo: Speak English Application can be an effective strategy to enhance the student's speaking Skills. In this Research, The researcher conducted classroom action research (CAR) in two cycles. Each cycle consisted of planning, acting, observing, and reflecting. The subjects of this Research were 25 students in eleventh grade at Madrasah Aliyah Negeri Palopo. The instrument in this research was Pre-test, post-test I, and Post-test 2, observation, questionnaire and Documentation. The Research was conducted collaboratively with the English Teacher of Madrasah Aliyah Negeri Palopo. The result of this Research shows that pre-test was 59.8, while in Cycle I was 75.4, and in cycle II the post-test average became 85.8. Indicates that the use Hallo: Speak English Application Strategy positively impacts students' speaking skills in the eleventh grade of Madrasah Aliyah Negeri Palopo. The researcher concludes that using Hallo: Speak English Application as a practical learning medium enhace students' speaking skills and confidences in speaking students are more enthusiastic, interested, and motivated to learn English.

CHAPTER I

INTRODUCTION

A. Background

English skills are critical in this digital era. English as a global lingua franca will also provide broad insight and facilitate activities with the international community. According to Research, English proficiency is closely related to a country's progress. Culture in a country can also change along with its openness to information, which is obtained by the initiative of its citizens to obtain credible news sources and knowledge that knows no boundaries to the tendency to share crucial topics.

Improving English language skills can be done in various ways. Today, with the ease of technology and increasing competition in the commercial education sector, the nation's next generation should have many opportunities to enhance their respective qualities. The way of teaching must also adapt to the learning patterns of students in Indonesia. With good curriculum analysis and design, it is hoped that this can lead to a tendency for the nation's next generation to like English lessons

In general, the development of smartphone technology in education has been widely used among students, teachers, and the general public. And this is also used to learn foreign languages, one of which is the use of online dictionaries and translation tools such as Google translate. These applications are available on Google Play and are designed with a mobile-assisted language learning (MALL) system, one of the sub-disciplines of e-learning-based learning media, regarding smartphone-supported learning with internet network access outside the classroom

and can be found in the electronic dictionary. The Application can access for free and is easy to use by its users without being limited by time and place.

From several existing applications, The researcher chose Hallo: Speak English can be used as an alternative learning medium, especially English. Application media is because Pahriah, P., & Khery, Y. (2018: 24-34). The Android operating system is a new generation mobile platform that allows developers to develop as expected. The mobile learning system can be applied quickly and cheaply but only complement the learning process. Android-based smartphones can use not only to communicate but also to learn. One example is the implementation of exciting learning media¹.

Furthermore, based on the pre-survey on February 11, 2022, for the eleventh graders of MAN Palopo,² The researcher obtained the data from the students by distributing the questionnaire. The speaking confidence in English is still low, showing that 42% of students choose to disagree somewhat, 33% of students decide to dispute, 17% of students choose to agree, and 8% of students decide to disagree somewhat. It means that the students' ability to speak English is still very low. In this case, the students must study hard to master it, and The teacher should create a good atmosphere in class. One of The teacher's responsibilities is to help their students to learn together using Multimedia.³ That happens from the techniques and media used in learning. Because the methods used in the learning process are: The

teacher delivers the material using the lecture method and without using the multimedia so that students feel bored. With teaching activities that tend to be monotonous and one-way, students are less enthusiastic about learning English, especially learning to speak.

Based on these findings, if this condition is left unchecked and does not receive serious attention, it will systematically impact students' abilities and learning achievements. Therefore it needs serious attention from teachers and support from all parties involved in solving these problems.

One of the steps to solve these problems is to use media in the form of applications in learning. Namely: Hello: Speak English. This is expected to help students learn efficiently. And with the media in the form of applications that can help students gain knowledge of a second language in class and outside the classroom without being limited by time and place. Therefore, The researcher will conduct the tittle. "The Implementation of Hallo: Speak English Application to Enhance English Speaking Skill at the Eleventh Grade of MAN Palopo."

B. Problem Statement

Based on the background of the problem outlined above, The researchers formulated the research questions:

- 1. Does the use of the Hallo Application enhance students' speaking skills in the Eleventh grade of MAN Palopo?
- 2. What is the student's Perception of using Hallo: Speak English Application to enhance speaking skills in the eleventh grade of MAN Palopo?

C. Objective of the Research

Relevant to the problem statement, the objective of the Research is:

- To determine whether the use of Hallo: Speak English Application enhances students' speaking skills in the Eleventh grade of MAN Palopo.
- 2. To find out the students' Perception towards the use of Hallo: Speak English Application to enhance speaking skills in the eleventh grade of MAN Palopo.

The result of the research is expected to be useful information to the learners of English generally who want to enhance speaking the result of this research is useful:

The result of the Research expects beneficial information for English teachers facing the same problem in improving students' speaking skills. The researcher also

hopes that students will not be bored learning to speak. The research result can be a reference for those who want to research English teaching and learning.

- b. This study gives some advantages, especially for The researcher, the respondents, and all students, regarding their speaking ability and Pronunciation.
- c. As a reference for other researchers who want to study Hallo: Speak English

 Application towards fluency on Pronunciation more intensively.

E. Scope of the Research

The Scope of the Research focused on using Hallo: Speak English Application to teach speaking for the Eleventh grade of MAN Palopo. The researcher emphasizes the speaking Skill, which consists of fluency, Pronunciation, vocabulary, grammatical accuracy, and interaction strategy.

CHAPTER II

REVIEW OF RELATED LITERATURE

Fluency, lexical sources, syntax, and Pronunciation are just a few aspects that

A. Previous Related Research

can be enhanced to enhance one's speaking ability. On the other hand, the scope of this investigation is limited to the enhancement of speaking ability through the use of language instruction provided by the Hallo: Speak English application. As a result, The researcher will give three different references to support their findings. 1. Shofi Nur Jannah (2020), in her thesis "Hello English Application as Supporting Device in English Learning Speaking Skill. "The purpose of this Research is to find the speaking contained in Hello English application, and the conversation practice games integrate and suitable with productive Skill. This study generally employs a qualitative research approach, descriptive analysis, and content analysis to uncover the types of speech and conversation now available in the Hello English app. Researchers conducted extensive testing to identify the best mobile app for teaching English before settling on Hello English. Researchers in this study relied on written records to collect data, which were then transcribed, coded, and tabulated for analysis. With this software, researchers utilize the Gail Jefferson transcription system, which has at least 15 distinct signs for indicating sounds, pitches, and vowels in conversational practice. The researcher finds several interactive lessons and games related to the linguistic aspect. To determine the speaking, The researcher must narrow down all the tasks, classify them into several terms, and code them depending on their number of phases. There are a total of 47 lessons focused on improving one's ability to communicate verbally; these lessons are organized into the following nine categories: 1) greeting/introduction; 2) as/giving something; 3) hobby/favorite things; 4) talk/expression; 5) describing/explaining something; 6) location; 7) occupation; 8) animal; and 9) other. Expertise in communication is necessary, but researchers also need a unique approach to analyzing and re-creating the discourse. The study's author concluded that the Hello English app would prove helpful as a speaking aid for students of English. When it's practical and engaging, it's more likely that students want to download it onto their smartphones.

2. Hidayati (2019), in her thesis "Students' Motivation to Learn English Using Mobile Applications: The Case of Duolingo and Hello English," Provided participants access to two free English learning apps and studied how they utilized the applications to supplement their English education. To be more specific, it investigated the participants' levels of English motivation in the context of learning English, how they utilized the apps and the question of whether or not the participants' varying levels of motivation influenced the amount of time they spent using the apps. The Research was carried out using a mixed method approach, and the tools used to collect data included a daily notebook and a questionnaire. According to the findings, the students demonstrated a high level of engagement in utilizing both apps. Despite only

having a surface level of interest, they could nevertheless benefit from the convenience and adaptability of learning English through applications. In addition, it was shown that students' English learning motivation had little bearing on the amount of time spent utilizing the apps; instead, the students' favorable response toward using the applications was a potential indicator of developing autonomous English learning outside of the classroom. A further comprehensive finding was discussed, along with critical questions about the current trends of mobile language acquisition. The researcher examined the Duolingo and Hello English applications simultaneously to compare them. And concluded that most students use Hello English in addition to Duolingo interchangeably. There were only a few students who decided to use only one program, either Duolingo or Hello English, because they found utilizing both applications at the same time to be complicated.

3. Yuanita, S. (2019). In her thesis, *The Implementation of Hello English Application as English Learning Media to Teach Speaking Skill in Tourism Major at the Tenth Grade Students at SMK 1 Karanganyar⁵, This Research uses qualitative description research and procedures in data collecting such as observation, interviewing, and Documentation. This study uses a theory developed by Hymes (1970) as a point of reference for determining and examining how the Hello English program might be used as an English learning medium to teach speaking ability. Both the instructor and the students*

participated as subjects in this investigation. In applying the material, the results of this study indicate, based on an analysis of the data, that The teacher divides the learning process into three parts such as pre-teaching, while teaching includes observing the step; question and answer step; gathering information or trial step; step of association or information processing; the communication step; and post-teaching. You can find these steps in the Application of the material. The students' answers to implementing The teacher's approach are favorable. This is because the kids can grasp and enjoy the learning process while the instructor is teaching them. The researcher concluded that a teacher should break up the learning process into three distinct phases: pre-teaching, during teaching (which included observing steps of association or information processing), and post-teaching. These phases include pre-teaching, while teaching, and post-teaching, respectively.

Hikma, dkk. (2021) "Improving Aliyah Student's Speaking Skill by Using *Podcast.*" The necessity of deploying technology in the teaching and learning process during the COVID-19 pandemic provided the impetus for this line of investigation. This study utilized a quasi-experimental methodology with a pretest and post-test design. The speaking exam and the questionnaire are the instruments that were used to collect the data. The speaking test was meant to get data regarding speaking achievement. At the same time, the questionnaire was used to obtain data about students' perspectives on using Podcast in the

speaking teaching and learning process. Both tests were administered to students. The researcher employed normality, homogeneity, and the t-test to assess the collected data. While in descriptive statistics, an analysis of the data is performed from the standpoint of the pupils.

According to the previously mentioned Research, technology implementation is one of the alternative ways to make students more interactive and involved in improving their English speaking skills. This study investigates the role of Hallo: Speak English Applications in enhancing students' speaking skills.

This is because Hallo: Speak English is an online learning platform that assists students in their pursuit of fluency in the English language by providing live English classes and real-time speaking clubs. Using the Hallo Application teaches a more participatory way to talk to the people using it. This is the essential benefit. Keeping this in mind, the purpose of this study is to investigate the implementation of Hallo: Speak English in enhancing students' speaking skills and the benefits and challenges associated with such a practice.

The previous study mostly used qualitative Research as a general research method procedure. In contrast, this study will use the Classroom Action Research (CAR) method to find out the students' current speaking and conversation that can be found in the Hello: Speak English Application. In addition, The researcher will examine how to use the Hallo: Speak English Application to teach speaking skills.

B. Literature Review

1. Multimedia

a. Interactive Multimedia in Teaching

Multimedia is essential in the teaching-learning process. Multimedia is required to achieve the goals of the teaching-learning process. According to Harmer, teachers should use various media or teaching aids when presenting material to students. Harmer (2001: 134) states, "as a language teacher, we use a variety of teaching aids to explain language meaning and construction, engage students in a topic or as the basis of a whole activity." Lever-Duffy and McDonald (2009: 61) add that media are technologies that facilitate teachers. According to the definitions above, media are tools, materials, or events that a teacher uses to enable instruction to acquire knowledge, skills, and attitudes and engage learners in a topic or as the basis of a whole activity.

b. Advantages of Multimedia in the Teaching-Learning Process

Using multimedia in the classroom is very important because it can enhance teaching-learning. Moreover, the students can comprehend the lesson quickly. Three types of media can be used in the teaching-learning process. They are (1) audio (tape, radio, compact disc, etc.); (2) visual (pictures, poster OHP, etc.); and (3) audio visual (television, video, VCD, computer, etc.). According to Brinton (2001: 461), media help teachers motivate students by bringing a slice of real life

into the classroom and presenting language in its more communicative context⁸. In addition, she summarizes the rationales for using media in the language classroom

as follows:

- Media can be an essential motivator for students in the language teachinglearning process.
- 2. Using audiovisual media, the students can create a contextualized situation within which language items are presented and practiced. Audiovisual media provide students with content, meaning, and guidance.
- 3. Media can provide some authentic materials so students can relate directly between the language classroom and the outside world.

Moreover, Sudjana and Rivai (2009:2) state the rationales for the use of media in the teaching-learning process as follows⁹:

- a. The teaching-learning process will be more interesting to enhance the student's motivation.
- b. The students will quickly understand the materials since the media will enable them to master the teaching objective well.
- c. The teaching methods will be various so the students will not get bored during the teaching-learning process.

Because they use various teaching methods, teachers can keep the teaching and learning process from becoming routine. In addition, the overall teaching and learning process will become more exciting. The kids will make up the second group. The student's interest and motivation might be sparked through the media. As a consequence of this, kids will participate more actively in the lesson. Additionally, the children had no trouble grasping the concepts being presented to them.

2. Speaking

a. Definition of Speaking

There are a lot of definitions of the word "speaking" that have been suggested by researchers in language learning. In Webster's New World Dictionary, speaking is to say words orally, communicate by talking, request, and make a speech (Nunan, 1995)¹⁰. According to Chaney (1998), speaking is the process of creating and sharing meaning using verbal and non -verbal symbols in different contexts¹¹. Bygate (1987) defined speaking as producing auditory signals to produce different

verbal responses in listeners. It is regarded as combining sounds systematically to form meaningful sentences¹².

b. The Aspect of Speaking

Speaking English well also helps students access up to update information in fields including science, technology, and health. The students have to master all components of speaking skills. According to Fulcher & Davidson (2006: 94), there are five components of speaking skills that can be defined as follows¹³:

- 1. Pronunciation: Pronunciation is how students produce more explicit language when speaking. The student can communicate effectively with a good accent and intonation despite limited vocabulary and grammar. Pronunciation refers to the traditional or customary utterance of words.
- 2. Grammar: Grammar is needed for the students to arrange correct sentences in conversation, both in written and oral forms. Grammar is a systematic way of accounting for and predicting an ideal speaker's or hearer's language knowledge. This is done by a set of rules or principles that can be used to generate all well-formed or grammatical utterances in the language. Thus, from the statement above, grammar is a rule that is needed for students to combine correct sentences in conversation, both in written and oral forms.
- **3.** Vocabulary: Vocabulary is essential for successful second language use. Without an extensive vocabulary, we cannot use the structure and function we

may have learned to comprehend communication. It can be said that one of the successes in touch is the power of words. It means that in spoken language or speaking, the vocabulary must be very familiar and used in everyday conversation to understand the said. Vocabulary is the knowledge of the meanings of words. This definition complicates that words come in at least two forms: oral and written. Oral vocabulary is the set of words for which we know the meanings when we speak or read orally. Written vocabulary consists of those words for which the purpose is known when the writing activities. These are important distinctions because beginning readers see the set of words as mainly oral representations. As they learn to read, written vocabulary plays an increasingly more significant role in literacy than oral vocabulary.

- 4. Fluency: Fluency is defined as the ability to speak communicatively, fluently, and accurately. Fluency usually refers to expressing oral language freely without interruption. In the teaching and learning process, if The teacher wants to check students' fluency, The teacher allows students to express themselves freely without interruption. The aim is to help students speak fluently and with ease. The teacher does not correct immediately, whereas the idea is that too much correction interferes with the flow of conversation.
- 5. Interaction Strategy: is an ability to perceive and process stretches of discourse to formulate representations of the meaning of sentences. Comprehension of a second language is more difficult to study since it is not directly observable and must be inferred from verbal and nonverbal responses by artificial instruments or by the intuition of The teacher or Researcher. In brief,

comprehension refers to the speakers' understanding of what they are saying to the listeners to avoid misunderstanding information.

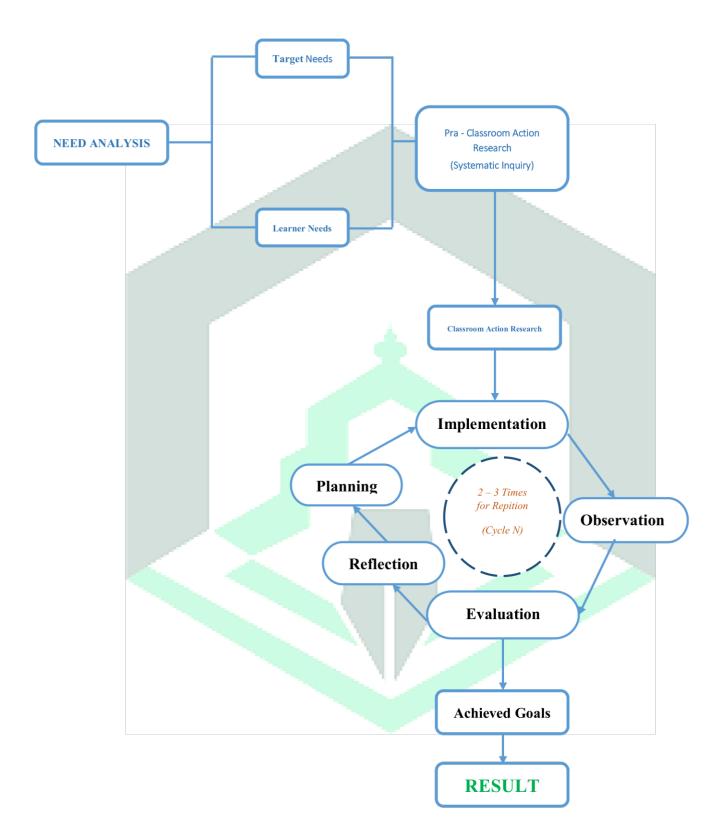


Figure 2.1 Conceptual Framework

The research framework is presented as follows, starting with:

- a) Define needs analysis (target needs and student needs) and will be carried out after collecting information from student interviews and questionnaires
- b) Define information from student interviews and questionnaires
- c) Define needs analysis. In this case, The researcher designs material based on needs analysis and the speaking learning syllabus at MAN Palopo.
- d) Design a Lesson Plan.
- e) Carry out Classroom Action Research procedures involving the Hallo:

 Speak English Application. At this stage, The researcher uses the Kemmis

 & McTaggart model.
- f) Trial with the Hallo application; Speak English by identifying the Application's validity, reliability, and eligibility. This aims to determine the effectiveness and attractiveness of the Hallo: Speak English application in improving speaking skills.
- g) Researchers distributed questionnaires and interviews.
- h) The results of the questionnaires and interviews are used as a reference for the Application Hallo: Speak English is the proper Application to enhance English speaking skills.

CHAPTER III METHOD OF THE RESEARCH

A. Research Design

This Research is Classroom Action Research (henceforth, CAR). According to Burns (2010: 2), action research is related to the ideas of "reflective practice," and "The teacher as researcher" involves taking a self-reflective, critical, and systematic approach to exploring your teaching context¹⁵. In other words, action research is defined as solving problems through direct Application in the classroom and improving teaching and learning outcomes. Furthermore, McKay (2006:29) says that action research has three major characteristics: it is carried out by practitioners (i.e., classroom teachers), it is collaborative, and it is aimed at changing things¹⁶. It means that action research can be done by a teacher in a classroom with the help of other teachers to discuss what and how to enhance the classroom activities so that the student's learning achievement will be better. Based on the definitions above, it concluded that CAR is a form of Research in which an idea in a social or educational situation is applied to enhance or change something to be better or to get a natural effect on the situation. The researcher used the CAR model developed by Kemmis & McTaggart (1998). This CAR was arranged into two cycles: Cycle one and Cycle two. Kemmis & McTaggart (1998) state that action

research typically involves four broad phases in the process of Research. The four phases in a cycle are¹⁷:

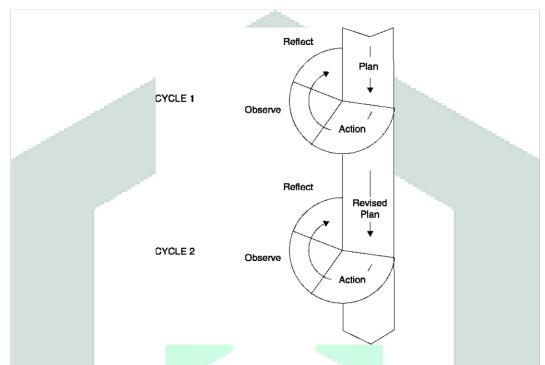


Figure 3.1 CAR Model Developed by Kemmis & McTaggart (1998)

- 1. Planning is the first step of the CAR procedure. This activity covers problem identification. The most critical step in conducting CAR since by knowing the problems, the writers can find an excellent solution to solve the issues.
- Action In this step, the scenario of learning teaching processes of English speaking skills through the implementation of Hallo: Speak English Application was implemented in the classroom activities.
- 3. The observation was done when the action was being done. In this step, the student's participation and behavior and the first Researcher's activity during

the learning teaching processes of English speaking skills through the implementation of Hallo: Speak English Application.

4. Reflection The data which were obtained such as the students' English speaking scores in the pre-test, post-test of Cycle one, and post-test of cycle 2, the extent of students' participation and behavior, and the first Researcher's action during the learning teaching processes of English speaking Skill through the implementation of Hallo: Speak English Application were collected and analyzed. In brief, the quantitative and qualitative data were analyzed to assess the student's progress or achievement in learning English speaking skills through Hallo: Speak English Application.

B. Location of the Research

Palopo.

The research location is significant to support the success of a study. Classroom action research (CAR) will be held at MAN Palopo. The researcher chose MAN Palopo because it wants to enhance further cooperation and learning outcomes for students who are less than optimal. This can be seen in students' lack of courage to ask and answer questions. The researcher did not use the learning model varied, and to strengthen this CAR research further, involving the school principal and The teacher council in the implementation from the planning, action, reflection, and revision stage, The researchers, conducted Research at MAN

C. The subject of the Research

The research subject of this CAR is the eleventh Grade of MAN Palopo.

The total number of students in that class is 25, consisting of 23 female and two male students.

D. Techniques of Collecting Data

The instrument for collecting data aims to support the success of the Research. This helps The researcher to get data and information about the process of increasing student activity in speaking, especially speaking in English, by using Hallo: Speak English Application

In conducting the Research, The researcher will use some instruments for collecting data. I would collect data from The Research from observation, tests, and interviews. The description is as follows:

1. Observations

The purpose of the observation that was carried out for this study was to compile a list of some observable student behaviors that show their comprehension of the subject matter. It is thought that the instructor can glean this comprehension from the activities and responses of the students while they are being taught. The researcher will make Observations to gather knowledge about human behavior as it occurs in the real world. We can gain a more accurate image of social life through words, which is challenging to do through other approaches. If we do not have access to much information regarding the issue being investigated, we will also

conduct observations. Researchers employ words because they are interested in understanding students' activities while using the Hallo: Speak English Application to enhance their speaking skills during the teaching and learning process.

In the section labeled "Observations," The researcher will present a list of observations that will serve as an instrument for collecting data. The following table serves as a checklist for statements made by The teacher during the word:

2. Test

The researcher utilized a pre-test and a post-test to determine the participants' level of proficiency in speaking. A skill like fluency in a foreign language can be evaluated using the speaking portion of the examination. The researcher in this study employed a speaking test for both the before and post-tests to assess the level of speaking ability possessed by the students and collect data. The oral exam evaluates candidates on five different aspects of their communication skills: their grammar, vocabulary, Pronunciation, fluency, and interaction strategy. According to Arikunto (1997:138), a test is a series of questions or exercises used to evaluate the Skill, knowledge, intelligence, and aptitude possessed by an individual or group.

a. Pre-test

The researcher gave the students a pre-test to know their linguistic competence in the teaching-learning process before teaching. This pre-test was given in the first Meeting before he had done Cycle I.

b. Post-test

The researcher also gave the students a post-test to know their linguistic competence. The researcher gave the two post-test. The first post-test was given in Cycle I, and the second post-test was given in Cycle II.

3. Documentation

The researcher collected the data about the matters of variables through the use of the documentary approach, which included taking notes, keeping a transcript book, and recording the interviews. The information pertinent to the investigation of the problems might be enhanced with the help of documents. In the framework of CAR, The researcher made use of a variety of documents, some of which are as follows: syllabuses and schemes of work; curriculum reports from school working parties and committees; assessment papers and tests; students' scores; students' and attendance lists. This study used the following documents: curriculum, students' names, speaking scores, and an image of the activities that took place in CAR.

4. Interview

The researcher gathered information regarding the student's and The teacher's responses before and after the teaching and learning process through interviews. The researcher inquired about various topics with the instructor and some students. The researcher interviewed the English instructor to obtain information pertinent to the Classroom Action Research. The researcher relied on the general interview guide to ensure that the interview process went off without a hitch.

C. Research Procedure

This action research is conducted through four activities: each exercise consists of four steps, as follows:

a. Planning

The first thing you should do when conducting Research is to make a planning list. The spotting of problems is the focus of this activity. The researcher and the collaborator will be able to develop an excellent solution to the problem if The researcher knows what the issues are. This is the most crucial step in the process of doing action research.

b. Action

After knowing the possible causes of the problems faced by the eleventhgrade students of MAN Palopo, the students had difficulties learning English

because their practice and vocabulary were low. This action aims to solve the problem.

c. Observation

The act of collecting data to supervise the degree to which the result of "action" fulfills the goal is the activity known as "observation." The data take quantitive and qualitative data. Quantitative statistics include the progress of the students (the students' score), while qualitative data cover things like the students' interests and how well they handle the class.

d. Reflecting

Reflecting on the development of oneself, students, and teaching methods is essential. Researchers and other partners can now evaluate whether or not the action activities achieve outcomes and progress. What kind of progress is being made, along with a discussion of the benefits and drawbacks of this development?

In planning, The researcher wants students to enjoy the lesson and enhance their speaking skills. He will use Hallo: Speak English Application to enhance students' speakingskills.

a. Cycle 1

1. Planning

- Analyzing the curriculum, especially the basic competence, after analyzing the needs of the students in the eleventh grade of MAN Palopo.
- b. Made a lesson plan about using Hallo: Speak EnglishApplication through dialogue inlearning speaking.
- c. Prepared the test.

d. Made the instrument that is used in a cycle of classroom action research.

2. Action

After providing some reading material on improving one's speaking skills, The researcher carries out the activity of doing twice treatment and then provides some samples of dialogue. After that, The researcher had the students use an application called Hallo: Speak English to practice and perfect their speaking skills.

At this level, the English instructor for class XI RISET takes learning actions based on the lesson plans that have been produced. These activities are part of the process of putting these actions into effect. Utilizing the program Hallo: Speak English is the strategy that is being used, and it is anticipated that this will increase students' interest in learning English.

. The researcher did some steps to doing each treatment. They are: 18

a. Initial Activities

- 1. Using the Hallo: Speak English Application in the teaching and learning process.
- 2. The teacher gives a simulation to students on how to learn through Hallo: Speak English Application.
- 3. The teacher gives an interview test to measure students" speaking in English.

- 4. The acting Teacher conveys greetings and prepares conditions for student learning.
- 5. The implementing Teacher introduces himself and assists the students in getting to know them, students.
- The implementing Teacher gives apperception to students, conveys today "s
 learning objectives, and distributes material through Hallo: Speak English
 Application.
- The teacher implementing the action gives the task that must be completed.

b. Core activities

- The teacher provides brief material about the general description of the material to be studied during the learning process.
- 2. Students do the assignments given.
- 3. Some students give examples of the dialogue delivered in front of the class.
- 4. The teacher guides students to pay attention to their dialogue groups.

c. Closing activities

After completing the learning activities in cycle 1, students are reminded to prepare the following material at the end of the Meeting.

3. Observation

In this step, The researcher observed all events or activities during the Research. During the learning process, The researcher observed the situation of the learning and teaching process and also the students' participation and evaluation.

4. Reflection

In this phase, all observations, data, and evaluations were reported and reflected to measure the weakness and the enhancement of the teaching-learning process and students' speaking Skills in both treatments. This step aims for The researcher and collaborative Teacher to study the intervention's outcomes. If the result does not show progress, we can revise the beginning plan. The researcher also did the Meeting to discuss the effect of the teaching-learning process. The researcher and The teacher tried to look for problems and solve them.

b. Cycle II

1. Planning

In the planning phase of the second Cycle, The researcher does several activities presented in the following.

- a. It was revising the lesson plan based on the problem faced by students within the first Cycle.
- b. Reselecting the material with and reforms the evaluation and the teaching instrument to enhance indicators that haven't been reached yet.

2. Action

It is similar to the acting phase in the first Cycle. The researcher did twice treatment with activities included:

- a. They are giving more information and explanation about the instrument they would be using.
- b. Give the task to students to practice conversation in Hallo: Speak English Application.

3. Observation

In this phase, The researcher observed the students' response, participation, and achievement, which are found during the teaching and learning process. The researcher used the observation form that The researcher had formed to collect the data.

4. Reflection

In this phase, The researcher evaluated students' progress in their speaking ability after teaching by using Hallo: Speak English Application. The researcher also asks the English's teacher opinion about the students' enhancement in speaking.

D. The technique of Data Analysis

Data from observations and interviews in this study can be seen from the scores on the observation sheet used. The percentage of achievement scores on the observation sheet is accumulated to determine the increase in student activity in the teaching and learning process, especially speaking using Hallo: Speak English Application. The percentage will be obtained from the average rate of student activity per Meeting.

1. Qualitative data

In this Research, the process of analyzing the qualitative data used some components, including analyzing data, presenting the data (it can be a percentage of data), and conclusion or verification. The data included in qualitative data are

Documentation and interview. The researcher then explained that raw data collected at the beginning of the Cycle are synthesized and summarized to suggest further episodes of the data collection and analysis. In turn, these data add to the assembly of information links that permit ideas to be formulated and other actions to be taken. Further action means that data analysis can be reviewed, and construction can be drawn.

2. Quantitative data

The researcher used quantitative data to support the research result, especially for the students' speaking results. The quantitative data are the students' speaking scores in pre-and post-tests. To measure the scoring system in speaking competence, The researcher measures the competency based on professor Cyril¹⁹; some indicators are supposed to measure speaking. The hand can be seen in the table below.

3. Criteria of the Success of Classroom Action Research

In this Research, The teacher and the collaborators determine the criteria for successful action. The action's success is based on observation. Suppose the observation result shows 75% of the students' activeness in the teaching and learning process and enhancement scores from the pre-test until the second post-test in Cycle two. In that case, they could pass the target score of the minimal mastery level criterion (KKM). The KKM that must be fulfilled considering the speaking subject is 77 (Seventy-seven), adapted from the school agreement (MAN Palopo). If the criterion of the action success is reached, the following action of the classroom action research would be stopped. Still, if the requirements have not been achieved, the alternative action would be done in the next Cycle.



CHAPTER IV FINDING AND DISCUSSION

This chapter deals with the research findings and the discussion. The findings in this part consist of the data obtained through the test to know the effect of teaching English by Increasing students' speaking skills using Hallo: Speak English Application. The findings that The researcher reported in this chapter are based on the analysis of data collected. The discussion deals with the description, arguments, and further interpretation of the findings in the Research.

A. Finding Research

1. The Description of Madrasah Aliyah Negeri Palopo

a. A Brief History of Its Establishment Madrasah Aliyah Negeri Palopo

Madrasah Aliyah is one of the formal institutions managed by the Ministry of Religion. The Palopo State Aliyah Madrasah (MAN Palopo) is a function transfer from the Palopo State Religious Teacher Education (PGAN Palopo). PGAN Palopo was initially founded in 1960. Its name was PGAN 4 Years (junior high school level), then the study period was increased by two years to become PGAN 6 years (high school level). This took place from 1968 to 1986. Then from 1986 to 1993, the learning period changed to three years after M.T.s changed from 4-Year PGAN at The teacher Education School (SPG) level. PGAN Palopo, which studied for three years, ended in 1993. Two years before the study period, PGAN Palopo, namely in 1990, was converted into Madrasah Aliyah Negeri Palopo (MAN Palopo).

This is based on the Decree of the Minister of Religion of the Republic of Indonesia, number 64 of 1990, on April 25, 1990²²

During the time from 1990 to the end of 2021, from PGAN Palopo and then changing its function to MAN Palopo, there have been several changes to the Principal, namely as follows:

Based on the table, the students got an average score of 59.8. The learning process was said success. The minimum standard of English lessons at MAN Palopo is at least 77. It is the lowest score of standard score. That's why The researcher chose a Hallo; Speak English Application to enhance their speaking skills in MAN Palopo.

Cycle 1

1. Planning

In this stage, The researcher to collaborate with an English teacher class is Mrs. Rahmawati S.S. The researcher and the collaborator planned to give material about Talking about self. The researcher and the collaborator prepared several things related to the teaching and learning process, such as: preparing the lesson, preparing the material, making the instrument that would be examined as the pretest and post-test in cycle 1 preparing the strategy that is used in interview strategy made observation sheet of the classification students', identified the problem and found the cause of the situation at first and the end of learning activities, and The researcher planned to give an evaluation to measure how far the students can accept the material that have been taught.

2. Acting

a. The first Meeting

The First Meeting was conducted on July 13, 2022. The researcher opened the lesson by greeting, checking the attendance list, and motivating the students. Afterward, The researcher explained what they would learn and what to reach.

The researcher introduced Hallo: Speak English Application and explained how to use the Application and then explained the material about "Talking about self", Do you know what talking about self is? The researcher explained the definition, function, structure, and example of Talking about self. After finishing her explanation, she gave the students a chance to ask questions.

After the material delivery was considered sufficient, The researcher made a lottery paper. Each student took the lottery paper to avoid dust when students were called one by one based on the student attendance list. In that way, students could also prepare themselves. After The researcher had done the lottery, The researcher explained how to have a dialogue through Hallo: Speak English Application with the topic "Talking about self" by using the InstaMatch feature to find someone as a talking partner. Students would have conversations like the previous Researcher did by using the InstaMatch feature and, of course, with the same topic. Students were enthusiastic and asked if they could bring a list of questions according to a predetermined theme. The researcher straightened that students would have a dialogue in English with a native speaker or non-native speaker (random people) and could bring a list of questions. Students were worried when The researcher said that students would have conversations with random people in Hallo: Speak English Application using English.

The researcher permitted the students to bring a list of questions when they were going to do a conversation test, and there was a slight relief on the students' faces. The student called forward to have a conversation and chose a friend they would talk to on Hallo: Speak English Application in their respective InstaMatch features. Some students are often skipped, so they must wait long to get friends to chat with random people in Hallo: Speak English Application using the InstaMatch feature. Almost all students still don't hear their voices because they are not too confident when carrying out conversations, but some have started to listen to their voices even though they are still a little not visible when having a dialogue. Some

students still don't have a clear pronunciation of English and are still hesitant to speak in English. Students who have not had their turn to come forward for the test with The researcher and collaborator practice in their place to make noise and not hear the conversation that is doing the test. The researcher and the collaborator provide opportunities for each student to discuss Hallo: Speak English Application within 1 minute, every student with the theme "Talking about self" using the InstaMatch feature. And then, The researcher and the collaborator assess students by paying attention to 5 aspects of speaking skills: Fluency, Vocabulary, Pronunciation, Grammatical Accuracy, and Instruction Strategy, as well as motivating to be more confident and correct students mistakes when having a conversation on the Hallo: Speak English Application by using the InstaMatch feature.

b. The Second Meeting

The second Meeting was conducted on July 15, 2022. The researcher began the lesson in the class by praying, greeting the students, checking the attendance list, and asking about the students' condition.

At this time, The researcher reviewed the material in the last Meeting. The researcher reviewed the explanation of the fabric of "Talking about Self." Then The researcher explained how to have a conversation in Hallo: The Speak English Application is still the same as yesterday, but there are a few changes. Students can no longer bring a list of questions to the fore as later dialogue material. Until the second Meeting, there were still students who did not feel confident, and finding a

partner to talk to in Hallo: Speak English Application in the InstaMatch feature was still challenging. At the second Meeting, students began to master well how to use the features available in Hallo: Speak English. Students were also given 5 minutes to practice in their respective places. Then they were called to do a speaking test with collaborators and researchers. Some students start to hear their voices when they are having conversations even though sometimes their votes don't come back, and there are also many students whose voices are still not audible. Student interaction is still less visible when and still looks hesitant to speak in English. Class conditions are still not entirely conducive because students who have not advanced are still busy practicing in their respective places. And then, The researcher and the collaborator assess students by paying attention to 5 aspects of speaking skills: Fluency, Vocabulary, Pronunciation, Grammatical Accuracy, and Instruction Strategy, as well as motivating to be more confident and correct students mistakes when having a conversation on the Hallo: Speak English Application by using the InstaMatch feature.

c. Post Test 1

The third Meeting was conducted on July 18, 2022. This Meeting was used to post-test one after the students were given action. The Meeting started by greeting, praying, checking the attendance list, and asking about the students' condition. Then, The researcher gave a post-test to the students to have a conversation and answer the question random people or native speakers in Hallo: Speak English Application.

In post-test 1, the result of the student's test was better than the students' test before giving treatment. In this session, The researcher got the impact of the students' post-test 1 in cycle 1. The result can be seen as follows:

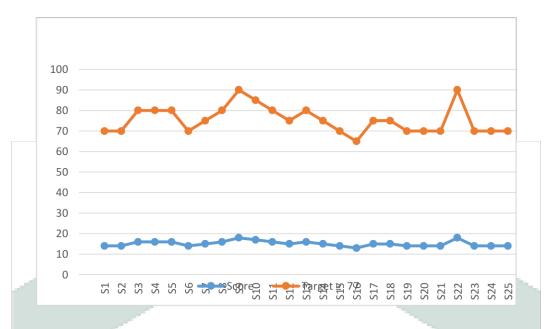


Figure 4.1 Diagram of the Result Test Students' Cycle 1

.The criteria of the students who successfully mastered the material were the students who got a minimum score of 65 and an average got 75.4. The learning process was successful when 80% got a score above 77. The fact showed that the result was unsatisfactory.

3. Observing

The researcher conducted two meetings in Cycle I. The researcher gave material about "Talking about Self." Based on the observation made by The researchers and the collaborators, it is concluded as follows:

a. Observation of The teacher

Based on the observation results in the one Cycle, The researcher has made an excellent Lesson Plan. The primary competency standards have made the Lesson Plan. The researcher has prepared media in the form of an Application, namely Hallo Speak English Application well, and can attract students' attention in learning speaking. The researcher has conveyed the learning objectives that will be achieved and appreciated at the beginning of the Meeting well.

b. Observation of Students

Observing students' activity in the classroom was the observer's duty. The researcher observed everything that happened in the classroom while the teaching and learning process was accomplished. Here, The researcher used observation that

has been formed The researcher concerning the cases to be observed along with the observation. The observer also noticed things not noted in the observation form using oral observation.

4. Reflecting

The result of Cycle I showed an enhancement in the result at pre-test and posttest 1. The students were interested enough in the learning process, although the condition of the learning process was still uncontrolled. Some students still did not focus on the material, making the condition noise.

The English learning process in cycle 1 was successful enough, although the students' average score was low. Nevertheless, there was an enhancement score in the post-test compared to the pre-test score. This is of illustration score in cycle 1:

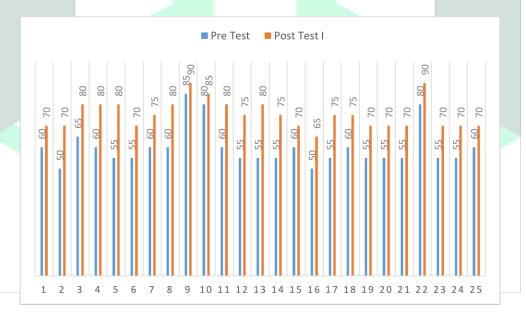


Figure 4.2 Diagram of the Result Test Students' Pre-test and Post-test Cycle 1

In this Research, The researcher gave a post-test to know the students speaking Skills. From the average score of pre-test and post-test Cycle one above, it can be seen that there was an enhancement in students' skills. The average score on the pre-test was 59.8, and the average score on post-test cycle 1 was 75.4. Based on the analysis above, The researcher concluded that this Research should continue in Cycle II. After finishing Cycle 2, The researcher and the collaborator discussed the teaching-learning process to make some reflections.

The researcher used classroom English in activities like opening and closing lesson, giving instructions, etc. Almost all students could comprehend the classroom language. However, some parts students could not understand well, primarily related to education. The researcher needed to repeat her instructions twice and sometimes translate them into Bahasa Indonesia to make students understand. In general, the students started to know and get used to the classroom

English. They could understand and respond to it. Some other problems appeared. It is related to class management.

The researcher found it challenging to manage the students and focus their attention on the learning process. Sometimes The researcher could not handle the students when they were using Hallo: Speak English Application and found their match in the Hallo: Speak English Application. Consequently, the class situation was crowded and related to time management. Therefore to avoid excessive noise in the students who will take the test, Hallo: Speak English Application as an assessment material takes place in the classroom while others are outside the classroom while waiting their turn for the speaking test but still under the supervision of The teacher. Thus, these two problems will be addressed in Cycle II.

Cycle II

Cycle II was similar to Cycle I. It was divided into planning, acting, observing, and reflecting. It was explained in more detail as follows:

1. Planning

In this step, The researcher collaborated with the English Teacher in the school Mrs. Rahmawati S.S. The researcher and the collaborator would like to make and discuss the lesson plan. Based on the students' results in Cycle I, The researcher and collaborator concluded that the problems were; some students were not confident and shy if they spoke English, it was challenging to express their idea, and the students were afraid if they made a mistake. Therefore, The researcher and collaborator tried to revise the several problems that appeared in Cycle I and arranged a lesson plan for continuing in Cycle II.

2. Acting

a. The First Meeting

The first Meeting was done on July 25, 2022. Before The researcher began the lesson, The researcher greeted the students when entering the classroom, checked the attendance list and asked about the students' conditions, gave an idea to the students about the teaching materials that would be learned, and made sure that students were ready to learn.

The researcher started with some questions about the material, "What is Giving and Opinion ?" Students answered enthusiastically. And then, The researcher gave the students a chance to ask a question. After the delivery of the material was considered sufficient, Researchers began to explain things about Hallo: Speak English Application again to students. The researcher informed students that students would have conversations on Hallo: Speak English Application with the InstaMatch feature like the previous days. Students still feel enthusiastic and ask whether the dialogue about Giving and Opinion is like the material that has been learned today or still with Talking about self-material, The researcher straightens that students will talk with material about Giving and Opinion, The researcher gives an example of a conversation directly through the Hallo: Speak English Application with the theme of Giving and Opinion, students also feel enthusiastic and prepare themselves, but it is different from the previous day the students who have not carried out the practice test outside the classroom to prevent noise in the classroom when other students are doing the speaking test. The students' voices during the speaking test had begun to sound more extensive and precise. Students have also started to appear to have their own strategy in carrying out conversations in Hallo: Speak English Application with native or non-native speakers, although they do not fully demonstrate it. Students who are not getting tests Hallo: Speak English Application, do not disturb their friends who are doing the test. They are busy practicing outside the classroom, preparing their turn to do the test in front of The researcher and collaborator. And then, The researcher and the collaborator assess students by paying attention to 5 aspects of speaking skills: Fluency, Vocabulary, Pronunciation, Grammatical Accuracy, and Instruction Strategy, as well as motivating to be more confident and correct students mistakes when having a conversation on the Hallo: Speak English Application by using the InstaMatch feature.

b. The Second Meeting

The second Meeting was conducted on August 1, 2022. The researcher began the lesson in the class by praying, greeting the students, checking the attendance list, and asking about the student's condition.

At this time, The researcher reviewed the material in the fourth Meeting. Students have understood the use of Hallo: Speak English Application, and no one else has difficulty accessing all the features available in Hallo: Speak English Application. Students also said that they have found and talked to many people through the InstaMatch feature so that aspects that exist in speaking skills begin to be fulfilled. Students are not afraid or shy anymore to go forward. Every student scrambles to be given a turn first to show their speaking skills. There are many

aspects that students have fulfilled when speaking because students are already used to conditions like this before. Students are no longer shy and afraid to express and interact. Class conditions are no longer crowded and noisy because each student is confident in performing their role in front of collaborators and researchers. The collaborator and The researcher were given the correction if they made mistakes in Pronunciation, intonation, or stress patterns after they had finished speaking with a native speaker or random people in Hallo: Speak English Application. And then, The researcher and the collaborator assess students by paying attention to 5 aspects of speaking skills: Fluency, Vocabulary, Pronunciation, Grammatical Accuracy, and Instruction Strategy, as well as motivating to be more confident and correct students mistakes when having a conversation on the Hallo: Speak English Application by using the InstaMatch feature.

c. Post Test II

To know how successful the learning was in improving the students' speaking skills by using the Hallo: Speak English Application strategy at the cycle 2, the post-test did on August 8, 2022. The researcher asked the students to speech monolog about giving, and their opinion practiced it using Hallo: Speak English Application. The post-test two has finished, and the result of it can be seen in the table bellows:

3. Observing

a. Observation of Teacher

Based on the observations in Cycle I, The researcher has made an excellent Lesson Plan. The Lesson Plan has been made following the basic competency standards. The researcher has prepared media in the form of an Application, namely Hallo: Speak English Application well and can attract students' attention in learning speaking. The researcher has conveyed the learning objectives that will be achieved and appreciated at the beginning of the Meeting well.

b. Observation of Students

Based on observational activities conducted by researchers and collaborators in Cycle II, The researchers and the collaborators found that student participation was excellent. Therefore students follow the learning process enthusiastically so that the class appears more active than before. The students feel accessible to Hallo: Speak

English Application and look very good at improving their English skills.

4. Reflecting

The result of Cycle II was better than Cycle I. There was a significant enhancement in this Cycle. The condition of the class was getting better than before. The students listened to The researcher and collaborator's explanation. In Cycle I, many students made noise during the learning activity and also when the test taking place in the speaking trial on Hallo: Speak English Application so that many of the students did not hear their voices, so in Cycle II, almost all students begin to see aspects of speaking Skill. The students are more active and interactive, making conversation with a native speaker or non-native speaker (random people), and students who do not take the test any longer make noise as in Cycle I because The researcher and the collaborator have provided a particular room for those who do the speaking test while those who have not done the speaking test experiment Hallo: Speak English Application outside the classroom under the supervision of a collaborator. The researcher and the collaborator have suggested that students always use the Application regularly to be more confident and bravest in presenting and expressing their ideas in speaking English.

Finally, The researcher concluded that using Hallo had solved the problem: Speak English Application. The teacher should motivate students always to use Hallo: Speak English Application and motivate the passive students to be brave enough to express their ideas. Furthermore, it proved that Hallo: Speak English Application could enhance students' speaking skills.

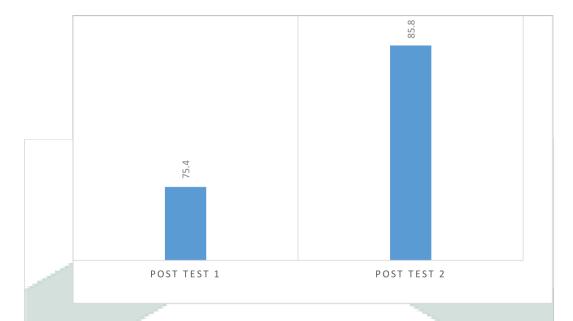


Figure 4.5 The Average of the Students' Speaking Skill Score on Post-Test 1 and Post-Test II

From the average score for the pre-test and post-test1 above, it can be seen that score for the pre-test was 59.52, and the score for post-test 1 was 69.76.

b. Action And Learning Result at Cycle II

The teaching and learning process in cycle 2 was on the climax situation. The students' scores enhanced significantly, and the class condition was conducive.

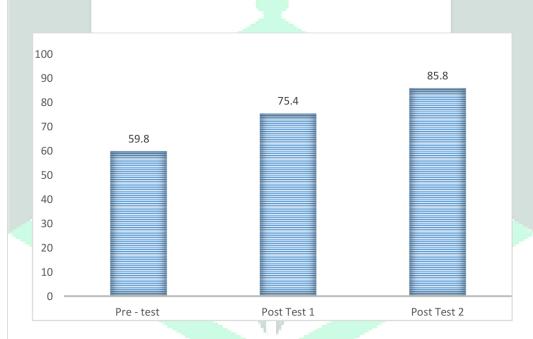


Figure 4.6 The Average of the Students' Speaking Skill Score on Pre-test Post-Test 1 and Post-Test II

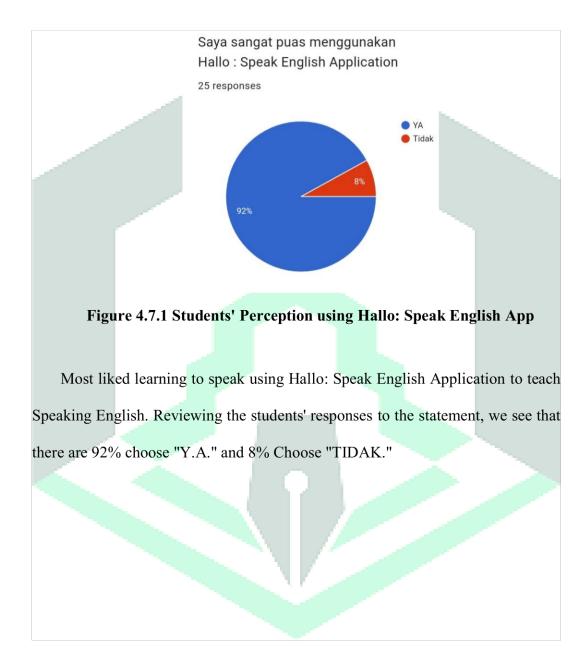




Figure 4.8.2 Student's Perception using Hallo: Speak English App

Most students supported the recommendation that their friends utilize Hallo: Speak English Application to teach Speaking English. Reviewing the students' responses to the statement, we see that there are 92% choose "Y.A." and 8% Choose "TIDAK."

After analyzing the questionnaire, The researcher found that most students were interested in learning to speak by using Hallo: Speak English Application. In addition, the data also showed that students felt that English movies could help them enhance their speaking skills. Thus, it can be concluded that Hallo: Speak English Application can be used in language classrooms to support and facilitate the students' speaking skills.

B. Discussion

This study aimed to find the effectiveness of Hallo: Speak English Application in improving the students' speaking skills. After the data collection and analysis, it can be seen clearly that Hallo: Speaking Skill effectively enhances the students' speaking skills. Besides, it was also found that the students had a positive perspective on the use of Hallo: Speaking English in English teaching and learning.

The background explained that the students lacked speaking performance in the classroom. And from the result of the pre-test also showed that most students could not speak English well because they felt it was difficult to Vocabulary and Pronounce English words, etc. Several students did not even feel willing to talk during the pre-test because they were not confident. However, during the implementation of Hallo: Speak English Application in the English class, most students felt interested and satisfied in practicing their speaking. Using Hallo: Speak English Application, they can converse with a native and non-native speaker (Random People) several times in the InstaMatch feature. Besides, they could also be learning with a native speaker/Teacher in the InstaClass feature. The number of students showed satisfactory progress in speaking. They can make their Pronunciation, grammatical, and vocabulary better, and they could also enhance their confidence when speaking in English. Besides, their motivation increased because of some reasons. They can use simple Applications in learning English, and they could utilize their gadget in the classroom and everywhere since the gadget was rarely used by The teachers there.

Based on the finding and the explanation above, Hallo: Speak English is more beneficial for increasing students' speaking Skills. The result of this study supports the previous Research done by; Kiddle and Czier (2011), who states that motivation is also strongly influenced by social and contextual factors. Students' immediate environment, teachers, and friends play an essential role in goal setting, attitude foundation, and influencing students' beliefs and the training and tenacity with which they carry out a learning activity.²³

In addition, the use of Hallo: Speak English Application to enhance speaking skill as the research has some similarities and differences with the previous study. The first from Shofi Nur Jannah (2020), in her thesis "Hello English Application as Supporting Device in English Learning Speaking Skill" The purpose of this Research is to find the speaking contained in Hello English application, and the conversation practice games integrate and suitable with productive Skill. This study generally employs a qualitative research approach, descriptive analysis, and content analysis to uncover the types of speech and conversation now available in the Hello English app. Researchers conducted extensive testing to identify the best mobile app for teaching English before settling on Hello English. Researchers in this study relied on written records to collect data, which were then transcribed, coded, and tabulated for analysis. With this software, researchers utilize the Gail

Jefferson transcription system, which has at least 15 distinct signs for indicating sounds, pitches, and vowels in conversational practice.

The researcher finds several interactive lessons and games related to the linguistic aspect. To determine the speaking, The researcher must narrow down all the tasks, classify them into several terms, and code them depending on their number of phases. There are a total of 47 lessons focused on improving one's ability to communicate verbally; these lessons are organized into the following nine categories: 1) greeting/introduction; 2) as/giving something; 3) hobby/favorite things; 4) talk/expression; 5) describing/explaining something; 6) location; 7) occupation; 8) animal; and 9) other. Expertise in communication is necessary, but researchers also need a unique approach to analyzing and re-creating the discourse. The study's author concluded that the Hello English app would prove helpful as a speaking aid for students of English. When it's practical and engaging, it's more likely that students will want to download it onto their smartphones.

The second researcher from Hidayati (2019), in her thesis "Students' Motivation to Learn English Using Mobile Applications: The Case of Duolingo and Hello English.

Provided participants access to two free English learning apps and studied how they utilized the applications to supplement their English education. To be more specific, it investigated the participants' levels of English motivation in the context of learning English, how they utilized the apps and the question of whether or not the participants' varying levels of motivation influenced the amount of time they spent using the apps. The Research was carried out using a mixed method approach, and the tools used to collect data included a daily notebook and a questionnaire. According to the findings, the students demonstrated a high level of engagement in utilizing both apps. Despite only having a surface

level of interest, they could nevertheless benefit from the convenience and adaptability of learning English through applications. In addition, it was shown that students' English learning motivation had little bearing on the amount of time spent utilizing the apps; instead, the students' favorable response toward using the applications was a potential indicator of developing autonomous English learning outside of the classroom. A further comprehensive finding was discussed, along with critical questions about the current trends of mobile language acquisition. The researcher examined the Duolingo and Hello English applications simultaneously to compare them. And concluded that most students use Hello English in addition to Duolingo interchangeably. There were only a few students who decided to use only one program, either Duolingo or Hello English, because they found utilizing both applications at the same time to be complicated.

The third from Yuanita, S. (2019). In her thesis, *The Implementation of Hello English Application as English Learning Media to Teach Speaking Skill in Tourism Major at the Tenth Grade Students at SMK 1 Karanganyar*, This Research uses qualitative description research and procedures in data collecting such as observation, interviewing, and Documentation. This study uses a theory developed by Hymes (1970) as a point of reference for determining and examining how the Hello English program might be used as an English learning medium to teach speaking ability. Both the instructor and the students participated as subjects in this investigation. In applying the material, the results of this study indicate, based on

an analysis of the data, that The teacher divides the learning process into three parts

such as pre-teaching, while teaching includes observing the step; question and

answer step; gathering information or trial step; step of association or information processing; the communication step; and post-teaching. You can find these steps in the Application of the material. The students' answers to implementing The teacher's approach are favorable. This is because the kids can grasp and enjoy the learning process while the instructor is teaching them. The researcher concluded that a teacher should break up the learning process into three distinct phases: preteaching, during teaching (which included observing steps of association or information processing), and post-teaching. These phases include pre-teaching, while teaching, and post-teaching, respectively.

And the last researcher form Hikma, dkk. (2021) "Improving Aliyah Student's Speaking Skill by Using Podcast. The necessity of deploying technology in the teaching and learning process during the COVID-19 pandemic provided the impetus for this line of investigation. This study utilized a quasi-experimental methodology with a pre-test and post-test design. The speaking exam and the questionnaire are the instruments that were used to collect the data. The speaking test was meant to get data regarding speaking achievement. At the same time, the questionnaire was used to obtain data about students' perspectives on using Podcast in the speaking teaching and learning process. Both tests were administered to students. The researcher employed normality, homogeneity, and the t-test to assess the collected data. While in descriptive statistics, an analysis of the data performed

from the standpoint of the students'.

Students are more motivated to learn to speak because they can practice interaction using English more often. This is also influenced by the rules applied by The teacher in the learning process in the Hallo: Speak English Application. Rules such as all interactions must be in English. Speaking is an ability obtained through students 'listening experience and courage in trying to speak English.

However, there was some scope of the Research. First, this study was conducted in minimal time. It was done in only 8 meetings and on two topic. Second, the Hallo: Speak English Application used in this study is very difficult to find a match for making conversation. Third, some students still have difficulties since the internet connection is unstable at school. It implies a suggestion for the institution to pay more attention to the facilities that support the use of technology during the teaching and learning process. However, hopefully, this Research will be helpful for English teachers as a reference in using or applying free online media in their classroom. Besides, it is also beneficial for other Researchers to do advanced Research dealing with Hallo: Speak English Application and other online media to enhance students learning achievement.

CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

This chapter presents conclusions and suggestions based on the previous chapter's data analysis and findings.

A. Conclusion

Hallo: Speaking English Application can enhance the students' Speaking Skills. The Students achieved this during the teaching-learning process. Hallo: Speaking English Application applies a learning community that makes students more active. It made them enthusiastic and more confident in speaking English. The enhancement of their result score supported it. It can be seen that there was an enhancement in the score of post-test one and post-test 2. In the post-test 2 there were 25% (25 students) got complete score and 0% (0 students) got incomplete score. The lowest score was 80, the highest score was 100, and the average score was higher than 85.8. The average score on post-test 1 is higher than 75.4. It means there was an improving score from post-tests 1 and 2. It means that the result of the two-cycle has already reached the indicator of success. That is, 80% of the students scored 77 or more. And this Research is regarded finished.

B. Suggestion

Based on the result of the Research above, the Research would like to suggest as follow:

1. For Students, suggested to:

- a. Active in learning process especially English speaking subject.
- Enhanced their speaking skills through talking with Hallo: Speaking English
 Application.

2. For English Teachers, suggested to:

- a. Having various strategies like talking Hallo: Speak English Application to teach English significantly enhance the student's speaking Skills.
- They have prepared some books to enhance their knowledge, especially in English subjects.

3. For Future Researcher, it suggested to:

Researcher who are interested in conducting research related to this research should try to apply learning through Hallo: Speak English Application with different feature to prove the effectiveness of speaking through all existing features on students' speaking achievement. And researchers must also modify and enhance further research so that students are more interested and enthusiastic in learning.

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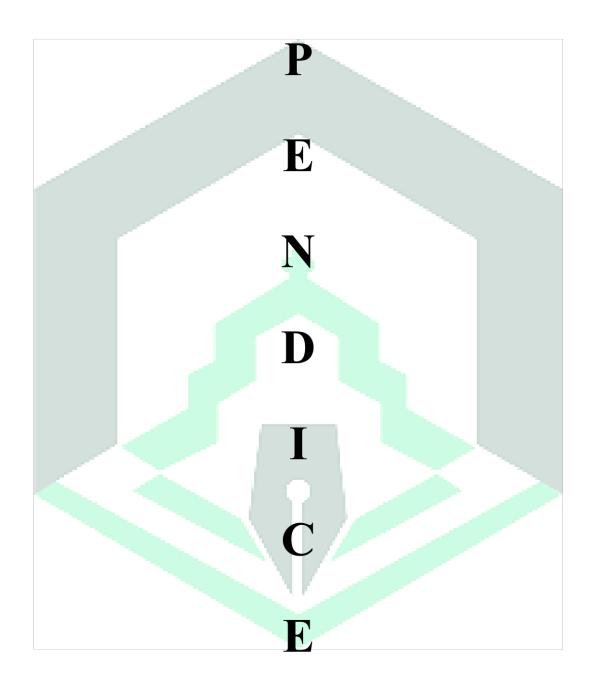
